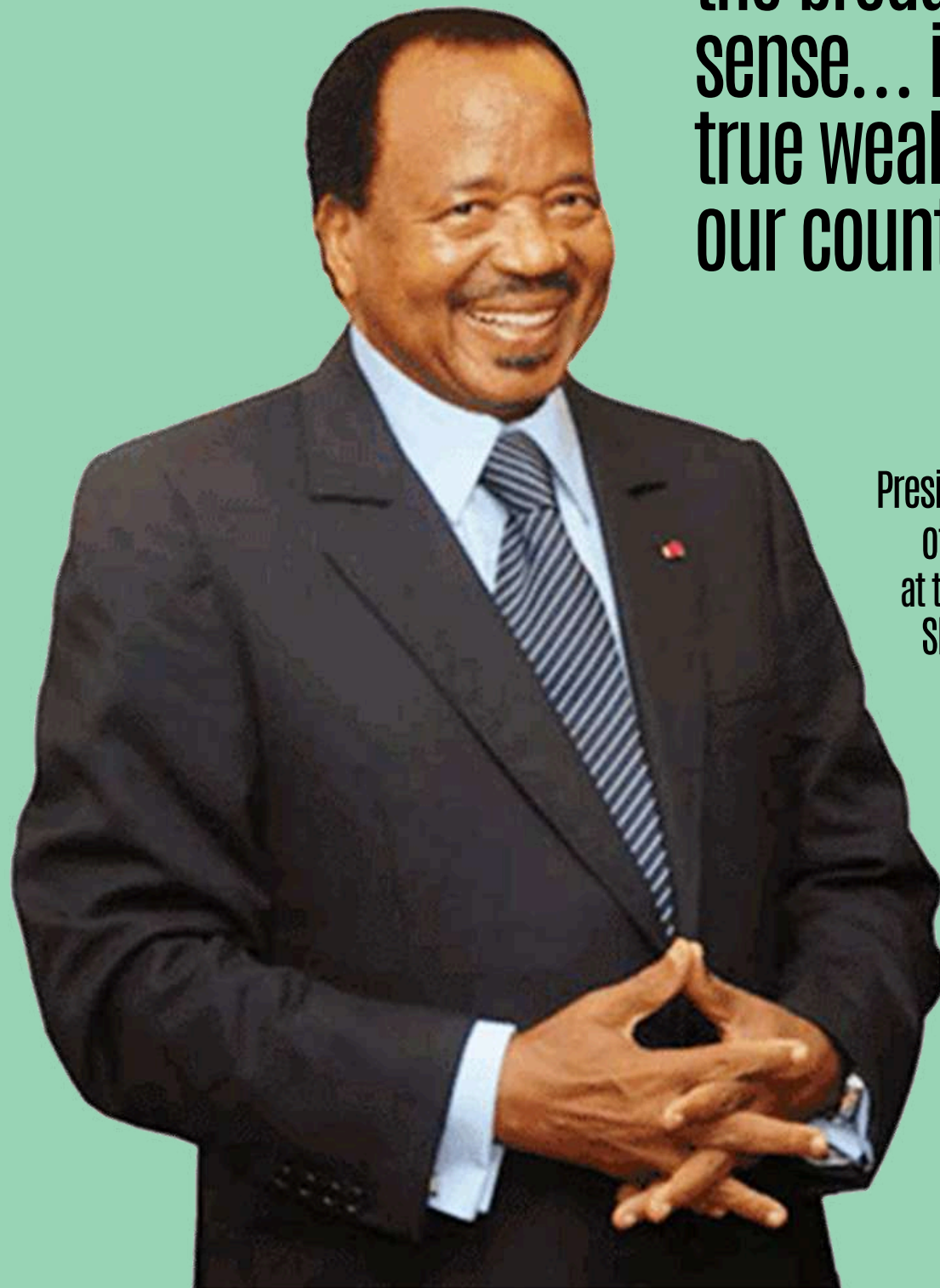

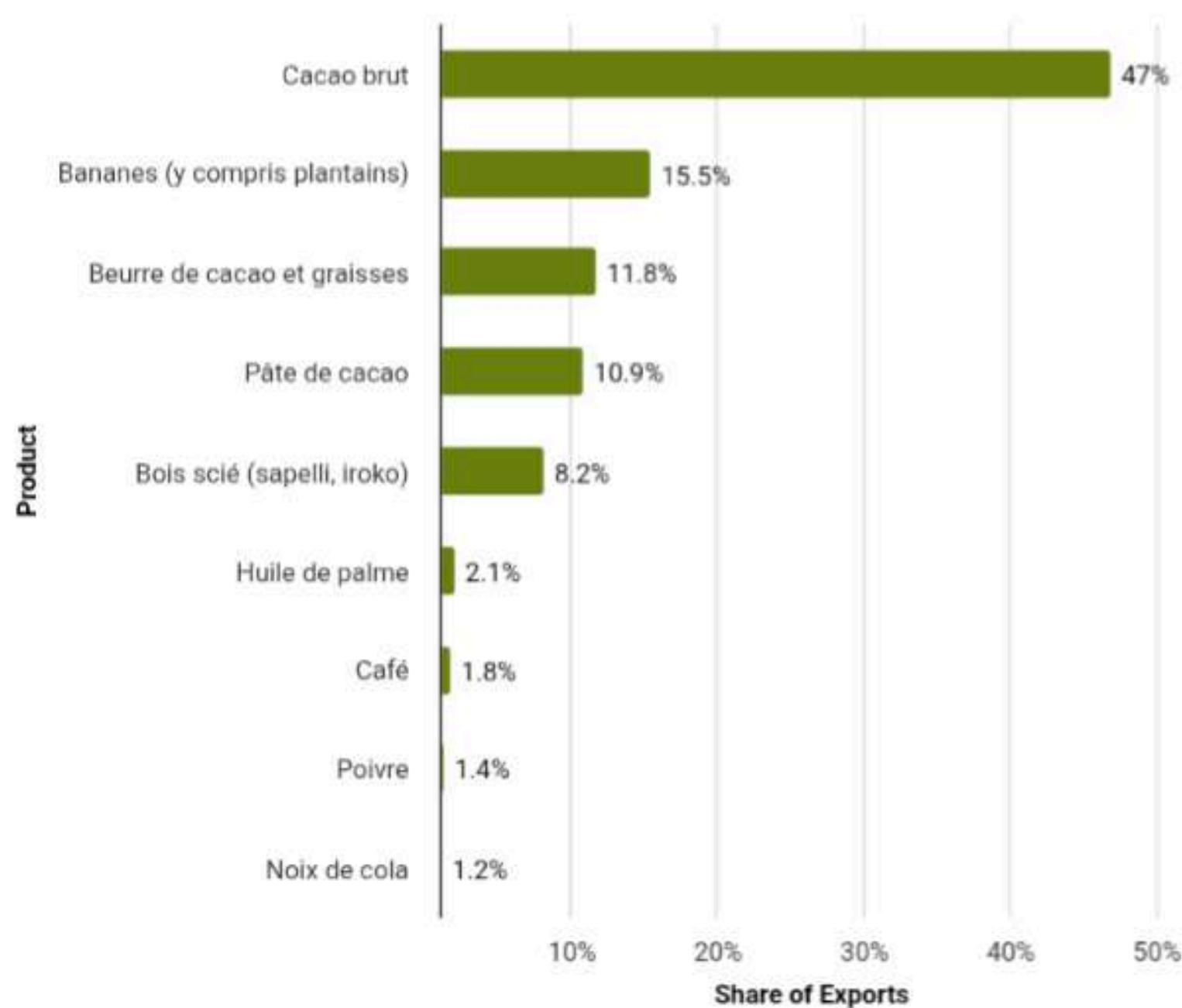

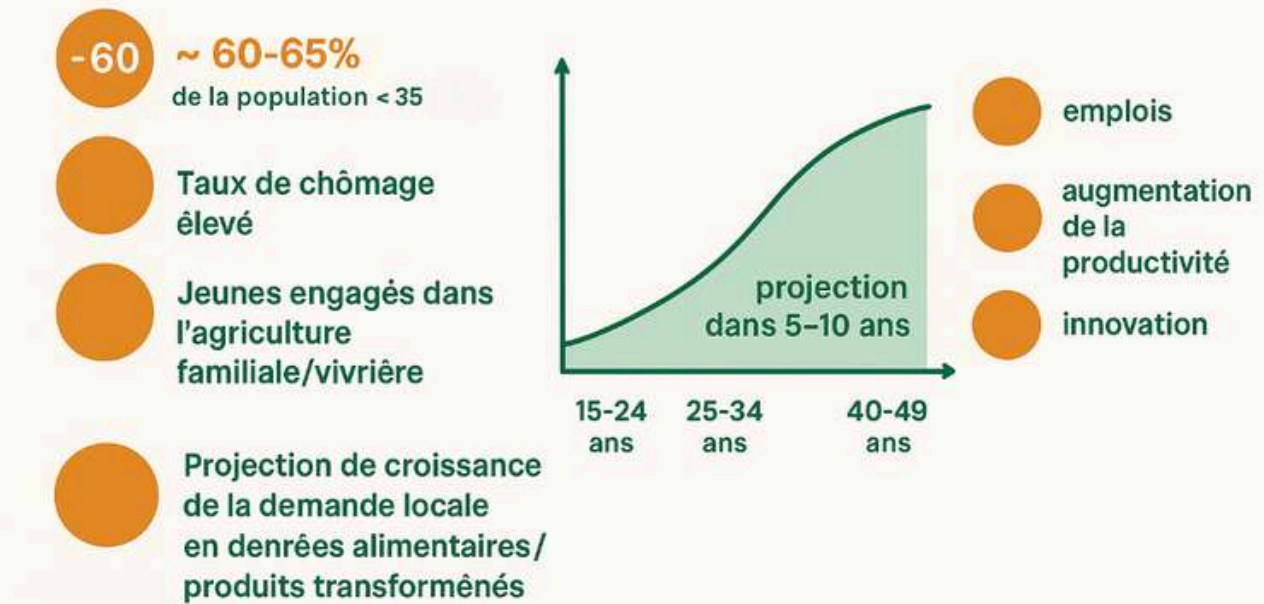

# Cameroon's agricultural productive potential thanks to its youth



With **over 7 million hectares of arable land, some of which remains uncultivated**, Cameroon possesses vast land reserves for modern and sustainable agriculture. The country is among Africa's leading producers of cocoa and bananas, and demonstrates strong potential in agri-food processing to meet the growing needs of local, regional, and international markets.



# A Unique Geostrategic Position

Located in the heart of Central Africa, **Cameroon is a natural hub for accessing a market of over 300 million consumers** (CEMAC and beyond). Its deep-water ports (Douala and Kribi), its road network, and its railway projects make it a prime logistics platform for exporting to Europe, Asia, and the United States.

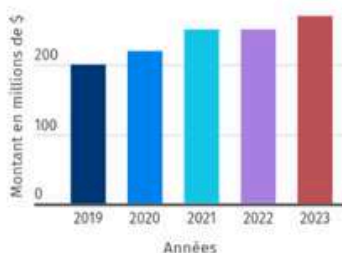
2019

En 2021, la contribution a fortement augmenté, atteignant 250 millions de dollars.



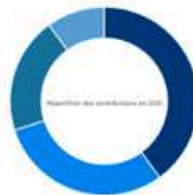
2023

## A booming fishing sector

With nearly 400 km of Atlantic coastline and extensive river networks, Cameroon has exceptional fishing potential. In recent years, public policies have promoted the sustainable development of artisanal, industrial and inland fishing, while also encouraging the growth of aquaculture.



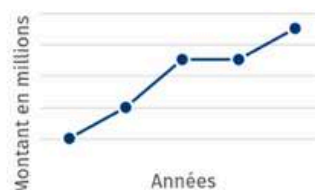
2020

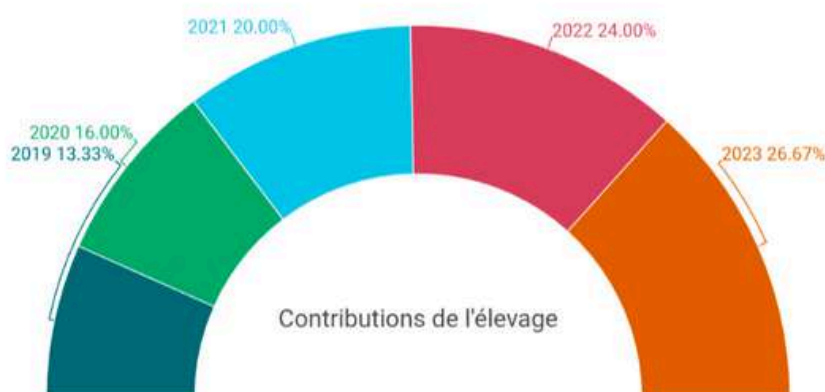

Alongside the traditional cattle farming sector, Cameroon is experiencing rapid modernization of pig farming, driven by the Pig Sector Development Project (Proporc), initiated by CAPEF. This project focuses on genetic improvement, professionalizing farmers, and structuring value chains.

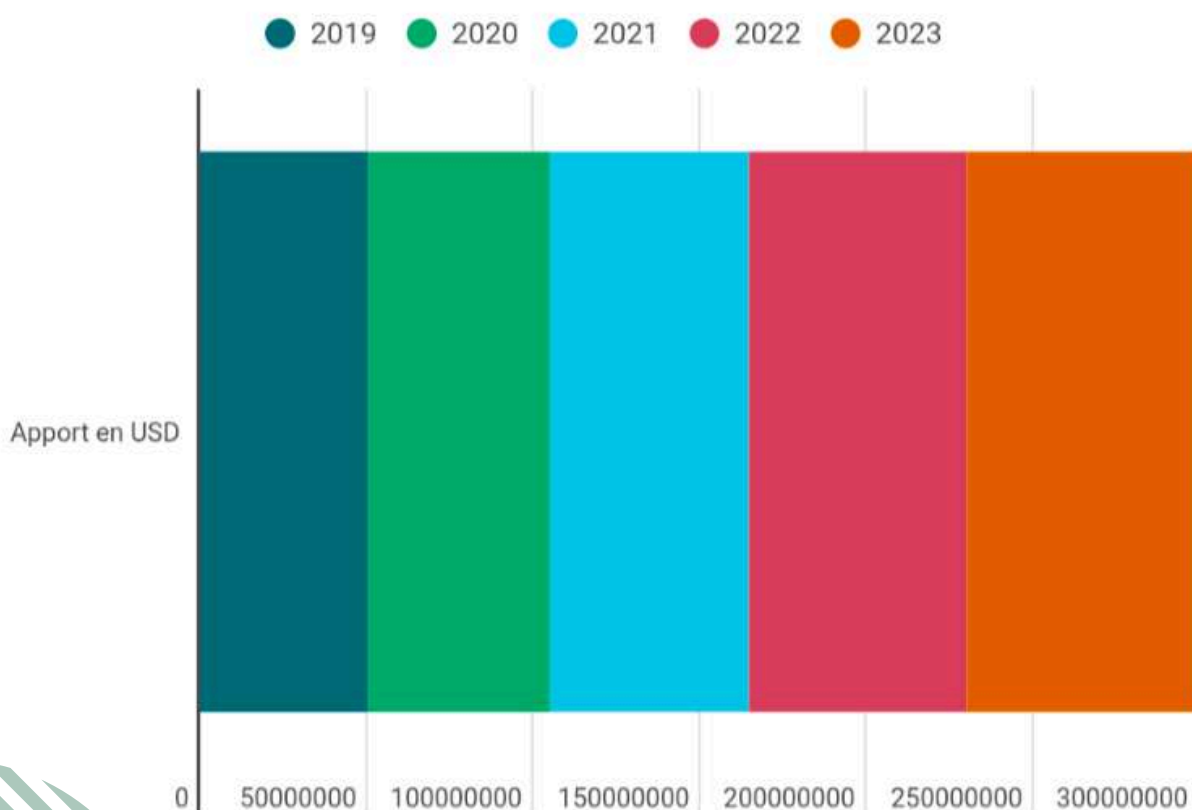
# A rich Forest Heritage

Nearly 40% of the national territory is covered with precious tree species: ayous, sapelli, azobé, bubinga, iroko, among others. The country is committed to the sustainable management of forest resources, combining conservation, certification, and local processing.

# Expected Outcomes for Cameroun in 2026



## Economic performance & exports

- Cocoa exports: + 20%
  - Target: 300,000 tons/year
- Enhanced valorization of processed products (chocolate, butter, cocoa powder)



## Investments & modernization

- €50-100 million in investments
- Modernization of value chains: cocoa, coffee, banana, organic farming



## Jobs & socio-economic inclusion

- Over 5,000 jobs created
- 500-1,000 direct and indirect jobs per project



## New markets & innovation

- +30-40% added value
- Premium segments: origin coffee, organic honey, certified banana

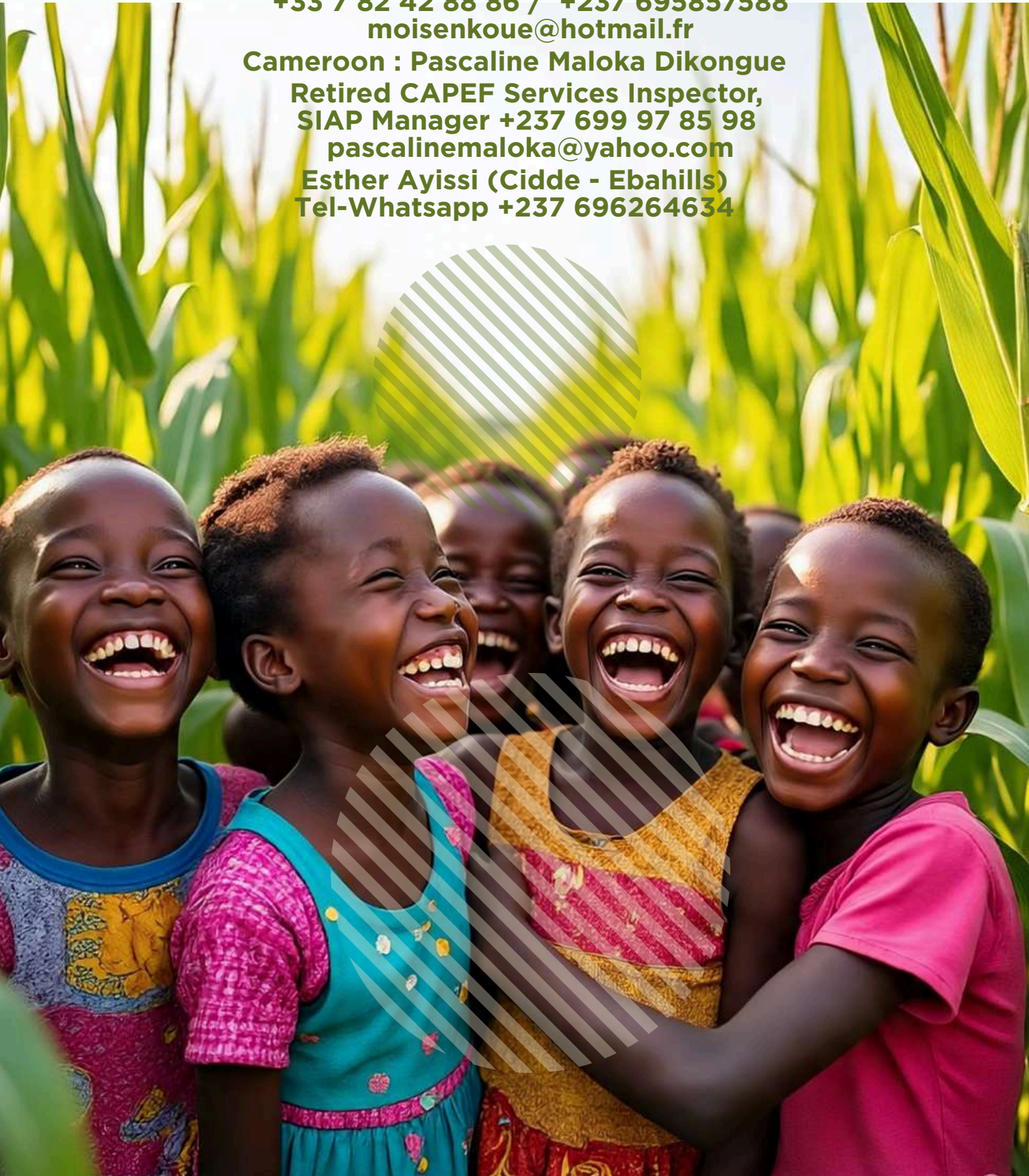
